Questions & Responses

Question: My child receives services in ½ of the classes. Will my child come to school (2) or (4) days each week?

Response: (4) days each week.

Question: If the child is running a fever, why would you allow the student to step onto the bus?

Response: For student safety reasons, our District will not leave a student alone at a bus stop.

Question: Are students able to bring water bottles into the classroom considering water fountains can't be used?

Response: Yes, students will be able to bring water bottles into the classrooms.

Question: What platform will be used for e-learning?

Response: Google Classroom

Question: On e-learning days (Wednesdays) will all students in each class be logging on to a "Live" classroom?

Response: A Parent Technology meeting has been scheduled on Thursday, August 12 at 6:00 PM in the Gym at Parkview School.

Question: Why can larger school districts go (5) days but our smaller school only (2) days?

Response: In order to meet social-distancing requirements, our classrooms can accommodate (14) students at a time.

Question: When will we know class assignments and cohorts?

Response: The class assignments and cohorts are posted at both school buildings in the entrance areas.

Question: Will there be a Latchkey Program?

Response: Yes, there will be a Latchkey Program available at LaSalle School.

Question: How often is Creve Coeur prepared to test the students? Which testing methods are you going to use?

Response: Students will be assessed as the school year begins in Reading & Mathematics. Fountas & Pinnell, NWEA / MAPS, teacher created assessments may be used to assess student proficiency levels.

Question: How many students are in a class? Can a child with an IEP do e-learning?

Response: (14) students per class in order to meet social-distancing requirements. Yes, a child can participate in e-learning?

Question: Will there be Teen Reach Program (Tutoring) offered at LaSalle & Parkview Schools?

Response: Yes, both LaSalle & Parkview School will offer tutoring through the Teen Reach Program.

Question: Will sports be played?

Response: At this juncture, we are considering offering a Baseball Camp in September. This will allow students to refine skills. This will depend upon COVID-19.

Question: What happens when the 1st Covid Case happens? Will we be notified?

Response: CC # 76 School District will follow guidance provided through the Tazewell County Health Department.

Question: Will there be Physical Education classes?

Response: At this juncture, there will not be Physical Education classes offered at LaSalle & Parkview School due to ISBE and social-distancing requirements.

Question: Will there be Band?

Response: Yes. There will be individual lessons and small-group instruction. Due to social-distancing requirements... large group instruction will be possible.

Question: Can students bring a cold lunch to school?

Response: Yes, students can bring a cold lunch to school.

Question: Is there a plan if COVID #'s drop to resume school (5) days a week?

Response: Yes. If ISBE guidelines will allow and if COVID #'s decrease to acceptable limits established by the Illinois Department of Health & Centers for Disease Control... school can resume (5) days a week.

Question: Do we need to buy all the supplies on the school supply list?

Response: If your child is enrolled to participate in "in-person learning", yes... the supplies will be needed.
